Phlebotomy Order Of Draw Explained - E Phlebotomy Training

In phlebotomy, this term has special meaning as it is the order in which certain tubes can be used. There are seven tubes which make up the order of draw. They are listed by chemical additives that have been introduced to the tube by the manufacturer to perform a specific function when mixed with the blood.

Phlebotomy Order of Draw. Phlebotomists must collect blood samples using collection tubes in a specific order while performing venipuncture on patients to avoid cross-contamination of the various additives between tubes. This process is known as the order of draw. Unfortunately for entry-level phlebotomists or those in phlebotomy training, this process can be quite confusing and often difficult to remember.

Considering the most common tubes used by nurses for venipuncture, here is the proper order of blood draw: aerobic blood culture anaerobic blood culture light blue red gold (SST) mint green green dark blue lavender.

Phlebotomy Order Of Draw. As you may already know, blood must be drawn and collected in tubes in a specific order, known as the Order of Draw. This is necessary to avoid cross-contamination of additives between the tubes. Unfortunately, this order can be hard to remember for those in training and even those in the field.

When collecting diagnostic blood specimens by venipuncture into evacuated tubes the order of draw is, based on Clinical and Laboratory Standards Institute's (CLSI) standard H3-A6 from November, 2007, as follows: 1.) Blood cultures (yellow) SPS (sterile) 2.)

It also discusses what can happen when the order of draw is disregarded. Additive carryover occurs when the needle filling a tube comes in contact with the blood/additive mixture as the tube fills, and transfers a minute amount of blood and additive into the next tube filled. This can occur with both syringe and vacuum draws.

The basic order of draw followed by most phlebotomy laboratories is as follows: Yellow Top (or Yellow-Black). This tube is used for blood cultures.

Blood collection tubes must be drawn in a specific order to avoid cross-contamination of additives between tubes. The recommended order of draw for plastic collection tubes is: First - blood culture bottle or tube (yellow or yellow-black top) Second - coagulation tube (light blue top).

Aerobic. Orange. Anaerobic. Yellow. Pediatric. 3-4. • One set of blood cultures includes one aerobic bottle and one anaerobic bottle • Remove plastic cap, then clean top of bottle with alcohol prior to sample collection. • Collect Aerobic bottle first, followed by Anaerobic bottle • Collect 8-10 mL sample into each bottle • Only collect 1 yellow bottle for pediatric blood culture order • Pediatric sample collection volume based on weight of child • Maximum pediatric bottle draw ...

Phlebotomy Order of Draw - MarketLab

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The order of draw is based on CLSI Procedures and Devices for the Collection of Capillary Blood Specimens; Approved Standard - Sixth Edition, September 2008. This standard recommends that EDTA tubes be drawn first to ensure good quality specimen, followed by other additive tubes and finally, serum specimen tubes.

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
